From the Principal's desk:

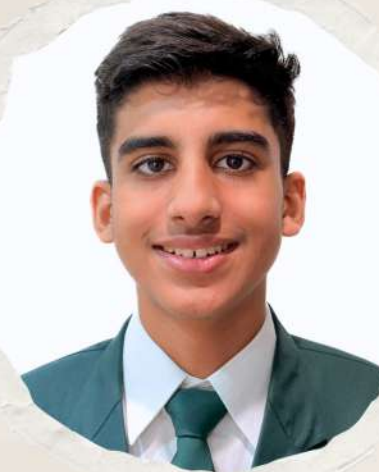

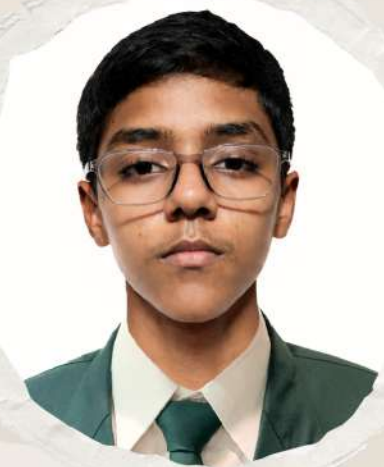


From the Editors:
